- **ILO President of the Year**

Please consider how the nominee demonstrated leadership abilities and took initiative to go above and beyond their expectations as the President.
- **ILO Executive Board Member of the Year**
 - The ILO Executive Board Member of the Year is an individual who exceeded expectations in advancing the mission, vision, and goals of their Involved Living Organization during the 2022-2023 academic year. Please consider how the nominee demonstrated leadership abilities and took the initiative to go above and beyond their expectations as an Executive Board Member. **Presidents are not eligible for this award.**

This event represented one or more of the following Residence Life core-pillars; Community, Wellness, Inclusion, and Learning. Please consider the program’s learning outcomes, the community’s response to the program, and creativity involved in planning the program.
- **RHAC Senator of the Year**
 - The RHAC Senator of the Year is a person who has showed a continued dedication to RHACs mission and 5 core pillars. This person has gone above and beyond to represent RHAC and their community council. They have been a leader in meetings and participated in aiding Housing and Residence Education to update practices in their respective communities.
